

Lynn Seirup is the Project Manager for the Public Safety GIS Data Development Center at the New York City Office of Emergency Management. The GIS Data Center is a new initiative aimed at the collection, development, and update of geospatial data sets needed by the five public safety agencies in New York City (police, fire, health, environmental protection, and emergency management). The Center focuses on increasing the depth and breadth of data sets needed for planning and response.

Ms. Seirup returned last year to the Office of Emergency Management after spending a year and a half at Columbia University's Center for International Earth Science Information Network (CIESIN), where she focused on population data sets and social vulnerability analysis. She worked for NYC OEM from 2002 to 2005 as a geographic information specialist and hazards modeler. Before becoming a geographer, she was a senior manager in the R&D division of Bloomberg L.P., with 15 years of experience in application development for the financial industry.

Ms. Seirup has an A.B. in Chinese Language and Literature from Oberlin College, a Master in International Affairs from Columbia University, and a Master of Arts in Geography from Hunter College of The City University of New York.
