

As Counselor to DHS Deputy Under Secretary Phil Reiting, McConnell serves as senior advisor on a host of strategic and policy matters related to the Directorate and its components, with a special focus on cybersecurity. McConnell most recently served on the Obama-Biden Presidential Transition Team, working on a variety of open government and technology issues. From 2000-2008, he created, built, and sold McConnell International and Government Futures, boutique consultancies that provided strategic and tactical advice in technology, business and government markets. Previously, McConnell was Director of the International Y2K Cooperation Center, where he coordinated regional and global critical information technology infrastructure organizations to promote information sharing and joint action, from 1999-2000. As Chief of Information Policy and Technology in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget from 1993-1999, he led the government-industry team that reformed U.S. encryption export policy, created an information security strategy for government agencies, redirected government technology procurement and management along commercial lines, and extended the presumption of open government information onto the Internet. McConnell holds an M.P.A. from the University of Washington and a B.S. from Stanford University.
