Thomas Bush is the Director of Analysis and Targeting for the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Office of Intelligence and Operations Coordination. Mr. Bush and his staff are responsible for assessing and reporting the threats that U.S. CBP faces through research, evaluation, and dissemination of trend analyses, intelligence alerts, and assessments. Additionally, Mr. Bush's team develops and evaluates intelligence-based targeting rules, Intelligence Driven Special Operations, and advanced analytic technologies.

Mr. Bush began his career as a program analyst for the Department of Defense Strategic Defense Initiative, and entered the U.S. Customs Service in 1994. During his tenure with legacy Customs and CBP, Mr. Bush served as a program analyst for the Office of Field Operations, the Director of Analytical Development for the Office of Strategic Trade, and Director of the Targeting and Analysis Systems Program Office in the Office of Information and Technology. In 2006, Mr. Bush joined the Office of Anti-Terrorism, where he acted as Executive Director prior to the establishment of the Office of Intelligence and Operations Coordination on 1 October 2007.

Mr. Bush holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Elon University in Elon, North Carolina. His numerous honors include the 1998 Commissioner's Unit Citation Award, the 2003 Commissioner's Annual Award for Innovation, 2008 Commissioner's Annual Award for Hurricane Recovery and the 2008 Secretary's Award for Excellence.
