

Dr. Jacqueline Newmyer is President and CEO of the Long Term Strategy Group, a Cambridge, Massachusetts-based defense consultancy. For the last five years, she has worked with the Office of the Secretary of Defense on projects related to East Asia. Recent studies include an analysis of the security implications of Chinese “downside” scenarios, an assessment of China’s capacity for technological innovation, and a book chapter on China’s energy security strategy.

Newmyer has held postdoctoral fellowships at the Belfer Center for Science & International Affairs at Harvard’s Kennedy School of Government and the John M. Olin Institute for Strategic Studies in the Government Department of Harvard’s Faculty of Arts & Sciences.
