

Professor Thomas J. Culora

Professor Culora is Chairman of the Warfare Analysis and Research Department at the U.S. Naval War College in Newport, RI. A former naval aviator with over 3000 flight hours, his command tours include Commanding Officer of the USS Boxer (LHD-4) an amphibious assault carrier and commanding officer of the HSL-47 "Saberhawks," a maritime strike helicopter squadron based in San Diego, California. He served on the Joint Staff where he helped develop US policy for NATO enlargement and was also Flag Secretary to the Chief of Naval Education and Training. His last tour while on active duty was Deputy Director for Strategy and Policy (N5) on the Navy staff.

From 2001 to 2002, Professor Culora was an Olin Fellow at Harvard University's Weatherhead Center. He was also a Military Fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations in New York from 2006-2007.

Professor Culora earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts from the School of Visual Arts in New York, an MA from the Naval Postgraduate School in International Relations and an MA from the Naval War College in Strategic Studies where he graduated with distinction.
