

Joseph Kraus Jr. Senior Vice President & General Manager

Mr. Kraus originally joined Aegis Research Corporation[™], later acquired by ManTech International Corporation, in 1999 following his 22 year career in the United States Air Force. ManTech International Corporation later acquired Aegis Research Corporation[™] in 2002.

As Senior Vice President and General Manager of the newly formed Security & Mission Assurance Business Unit, Mr. Kraus currently oversees \$134.2M revenue, 50 programs, and 770 nation-wide personnel.

Mr. Kraus's career with ManTech International Corporation began as a Senior Security Analyst supporting the company's largest customer; he played a key role in defining current National Security Program Protection strategies.

In April 2003 he was promoted to Vice President of the new Advanced Programs Division. In this role, Mr. Kraus was responsible for the Program Management, Cost & Scheduling for 11 contracts accounting for \$18 Million+ in the company's annual revenue.

In October 2004, he assumed duties as Vice President, Defense Programs Group managing a contract portfolio consisting of 26 contracts with a \$32 Million revenue base. In March 2005, Mr. Kraus was promoted to Senior Vice President, Defense Programs Group overseeing 350 personnel located across the United States and overseas with a \$60 Million revenue base. Additionally, acting as Capture Manager, Mr. Kraus secured the \$200M/10 year 9000/Arthur contract re-compete award.

In October 2004, Mr. Kraus was appointed as Vice President to lead the Security Division which consists of a \$98 Million revenue base, 35 contracts, and 600+ personnel supporting Department of Defense, Intelligence Community, and Federal requirements.

Mr. Kraus has over 37 years of acquisition and operational program protection Special Access Program (SAP) experience, to include an assignment during his USAF tenure as the initial System Security Engineer, Headquarters Air Combat Command, Directorate of Requirements. In this role he articulated and executed 21st Century program protection strategies for weapon systems such as the F-22. Ultimately retiring at the rank of Chief Master Sergeant, his final USAF assignment was within the White House Military Office, Special Programs Office and he is a recipient of the Presidential Service Badge.

Mr. Kraus regularly participates in several marathons, such as the Annual Marine Corps Marathon, and 100 mile bike rides annually to raise funds for local and national charities such as Inheritance of Hope, Autism, and Diabetes organizations. Additionally, he is the Springfield Youth Club (SYC) Soccer U10G League Director and Coach.
