# Executive Summary



*Coalition Warrior Interoperability Demonstration (CWID) is a Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff*

*annual event featuring Interoperability Trials (ITs) focused on selected core objectives defined by combatant commanders.*

- *The demonstration tests and evaluates technologies and capabilities for exchanging information among agencies, services and this year, the host combatant commander, U.S. Northern Command (USNORTHCOM).*



*CWID enables U.S. combatant commands and the international community to investigate command, control, communications, computers, intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance (C4ISR) solutions that focus on relevant and timely objectives for enhancing coalition interoperability. The word “coalition,” having undergone redefinition since Sept. 11, 2001, includes government agencies, national and international law enforcement and first responders, as well as traditional military allies.*

- *U.S. Joint Forces Command (USJFCOM), Norfolk, Va., is responsible for planning and execution oversight of CWID. The command will target information technologies that can be moved into operational use within 18 months of the execution period. The CWID scenario incorporates aspects of Homeland Security and Homeland Defense (HLS/HLD) with traditional coalition operations, enabling the demonstration’s use as a proving ground for emerging technology application through the entire spectrum of first responders.*



- *The Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA), Arlington, Va., manages day-to-day program operations, directs the demonstration’s*

INTRODUCTION

*execution and engineers the demonstration network. In the past, demonstrations utilized the Combined Federated Battle Laboratories Network (CFBLNet) blue classified network and the DISN-LES unclassified network. In 2005 CWID takes a different approach. The need for scalability and flexibility drove development of a new classified coalition information space called Coalition Secret Network, or "Purple Enclave." The architecture enables controlled and protected communications as prescribed by operational requirements and national security policies — a network driven by events.*



- *CWID is scheduled for execution and technology assessment 13-23 June 2005, with a set-up week 6-10 June. Assessments will be published in a formal report later in 2005.*

- *The host site is USNORTH-COM, in Colorado Springs, Colo., but you can experience operations and interoperability trials at sites worldwide. Other U.S. visitor sites include: the U.S. Army, U.S. Marine Corps and National Guard Bureau at Naval Surface Warfare Center, Dahlgren, Va.; the U.S. Navy at SPAWAR, San Diego, Calif.; and the U.S. Air Force at Electronic Systems Center, Hanscom AFB, Mass.*

- *The global network includes Australia, Canada, New Zealand, United Kingdom, and many NATO nations, also with demonstration sites and visitor access. NATO is hosting observers Russia and Portugal for the first time. In fact, there are 26 international participants at nearly 30 sites around the world.*
