Ms. Jennifer Mantooth is the Acting Division Chief of the Army's Civilian Information Technology Management (ITM) Career Program 34 (CP-34) Proponency Office within the Headquarters, Department of the Army Chief Information Officer/G-6. As Division Chief, she currently leads the Army's IT Workforce 2028 Initiative.

Ms. Mantooth was selected for one of five Digital Curation Fellowships from the incoming class of 2007 at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC Chapel Hill). Her work has been published and presented at academic forums in the digital archives domain. Throughout the duration of her academic pursuits at UNC Chapel Hill, Ms. Mantooth was actively involved in the management of [ibiblio.org](http://ibiblio.org), an open-source digital repository providing public access to software and special interest publications.

Ms. Mantooth joined the federal civilian service in 2009 and has previous experience as the IT training manager at U.S. Army Forces Command (FORSCOM). Prior to her current position, she served as CIO/G-6 Team Lead for Workforce Development within the CP-34 Proponency Office. During her tenure, she created the course-based CP-34 Certification Program to provide the IT workforce with a resourced, robust, and tiered training plan to develop the breadth of skills required for a well-rounded IT professional.

Ms. Mantooth was awarded the Commander's Award for Civilian Service for providing expert guidance and support to FORSCOM personnel. Ms. Mantooth holds a master's degree in Information Science from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a bachelor's degree in Computer Science from North Carolina State University. She grew up in Raleigh, North Carolina.
