

Mr. John Lombardi assumed duties as the Associate Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Mission Integration March 2020.

Previously, Mr. Lombardi served as the Assistant Director of National Intelligence for Mission Performance, Analysis, and Collection. In this capacity, he leads MPAC efforts to integrate Intelligence Community (IC) collection and analysis, evaluate IC mission performance, and develop innovative intelligence capabilities to respond to mission challenges and opportunities.

Mr. Lombardi was designated the National Intelligence Manager for Transnational Crime, Homeland, and Western Hemisphere where he integrated IC efforts across the Western Hemisphere, the polar regions, and within the Homeland, and developed and implemented national-level strategies to combat transnational crime. Mr. Lombardi also served as the Intelligence Community representative to the U.S. Government's Interdiction Committee and U.S. Council on Transnational Organized Crime. He previously served as the Deputy and Acting National Intelligence Manager for Europe and Eurasia integrating IC activities in Europe and Eurasia.

Mr. Lombardi established and served as the first Head of the NATO Intelligence Unit, which provided integrated intelligence to the North Atlantic Council, the NATO Military Committee and the Supreme Allied Commander-Europe. He also served as a senior member of the NATO Intelligence Steering Board, and the Head of the NATO Terrorist Threat Intelligence Unit.

Mr. Lombardi joined the National Counterterrorism Center (NCTC) and served as Chief of the Analytic Advancement Group, Office of Mission Management, where he worked across the CT community to improve analysis and targeting support to national civilian and military decision makers and operational planners. He was posted to NATO Headquarters as the NCTC liaison officer.

Mr. Lombardi worked at the Defense Intelligence Agency, Joint Intelligence Task Force – Combatting Terrorism (JITF-CT), completing assignments as the Chief of the Pentagon Support Branch and Chief of the Iraq Branch. Mr. Lombardi also deployed as the JIFT-CT liaison officer and Chief of the Terrorist and Foreign Fighters team, Multinational Forces – Iraq.

Mr. Lombardi began his career at the U.S. Southern Command, Joint Intelligence Center, where he served as the Center's Deputy Chief/Senior Intelligence Officer of the Transnational Issues Division and the Deputy Chief/Senior Intelligence Officer of the Regional Assessments Division.

Mr. Lombardi graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Indiana University and Master of Arts in Latin American Studies and International Developmental Public Policy Administration from the University of Florida.

Mr. Lombardi is married to the former Shannon Curtin of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. They have two daughters.
