YOUNG AFCEA SPOTLIGHT

Senior Master Sgt. John Walker, USAF, is stationed at Spangdahlem Air Base, Germany. In his current capacity, he serves as the Plans and Resources Flight Chief for the U.S. Air Force 52nd Communications Squadron. He oversees all cyber-related projects for the fighter wing and its five geographical separated units spanning across Europe.

As one of the Young AFCEA Advisory Council (YAAC) Vice Presidents of International, his role is to advise the YAAC Executive Committee, the Regional Vice Presidents (RVP) that reside overseas, the International Regional Young AFCEA Chairs (RYACs), and the General Manager of AFCEA Europe, Erich Staudacher.



The position of YAAC Vice President of International is co-chaired, ideally by one military and one civilian representative from any AFCEA International region, when possible. The co-chair can serve consecutive terms in office until the end of the year when he/she turns 40 and must be a member of AFCEA during his/ her entire period of service. Each YAAC Co-VP International shall be an active member of the YAAC, acting as the voice of International RYACs to represent International ideas and positions to AFCEA International and the YAAC. This position will provide support to the Council and its Co-Presidents in all activities to include, but not limited to:

- Provide a central point of contact to the AFCEA headquarters staff for International YAFCEAN activities;
- Serve as central point of contact for International RVPs, RYACs, and chapters to get information and assistance in all YAFCEAN matters;
- Mentor and assist International chapters and regions in growing and sustaining International YAFCEAN activities; and
- Represent the International YAFCEANs at the annual YAAC Board of Directors meeting, when possible.
